In our hearts and prayers

All Saints School Uniform



We encourage children to wear a school uniform. This promotes equality and a sense of belonging amongst our children.

- **Maroon Sweatshirt or Cardigan**

It is possible to buy fleeces with the school logo on. They are super for outdoor play and activities when it is not raining. Children are **not** permitted to wear their fleece in the classroom. They often result in children being too hot to concentrate to their full potential.



- **Grey Trousers, Pinafore Dress, Skirts or Shorts**

- **White Shirt or Polo Shirt**

- **Black, sensible school shoes (flat with no open toes)**

The children's feet are growing and it is important they have the correct footwear to ensure they have adequate support and remain healthy. Children are not allowed to wear pumps, trainers or fabric footwear throughout the school day. They are also not permitted to wear boots. We appreciate footwear can be expensive. Please contact the office as you maybe eligible to apply for 'Boot fund', a registered charity.

- **Red and White Gingham Check Summer Dress**

- **No Jewellery** (except for small stud earrings and jewellery that works for religious purposes)
- **Hair** should be tied back, if worn long, to minimise the risk of entanglement. Hair accessories should be subtle and in school colours.

P.E. Kit

- **Plain white T-Shirt**
- **Black shorts**
- **Black P.E. pumps or trainers**
- **Black joggers or leggings** (for outdoor PE)



Please leave your child's P.E. kit in a named P.E. bag in school. We will send them home each half-term to be washed.


